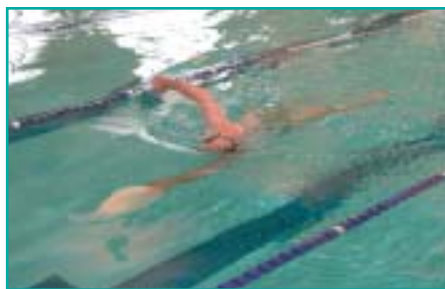

Community Standards Corner

It's Spring and time to change your irrigation clock! Las Vegas Valley Water District has the following water patterns to consider for keeping your lawn and plants healthy and safe in the desert climate.

Adjusting your irrigation clock now ensures that your landscape gets the water it needs and keeps their vitality throughout the warmer months. Following are the guidelines for March and April:

Lawn:	Plants:
4 days/week	2 days/week
3 times/day	1 time/watering day
4 minutes each	12 minutes each

Daylight savings time begins April 7. Don't forget to change your irrigation clock when changing your indoor clocks to continue your regular watering schedule.

If you need help setting your irrigation clock, the SNWA Conservation Helpline will assist you with this. Their number is (702) 258-SAVE. The Water Authority will send someone to your property to teach you how to change your clock.

The SNWA is now taking applications for their Landscape Awards. If you are proud of your water-efficient landscape, then enter your landscape design in the 2002 SNWA Landscape Awards. The deadline to enter is April 12. More on this topic can be viewed on their website at www.snwa.com.

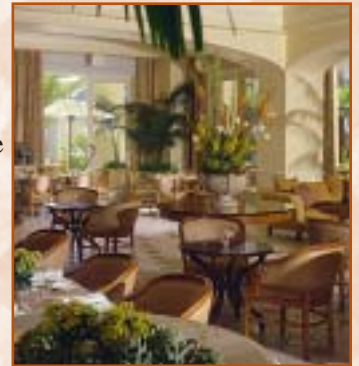

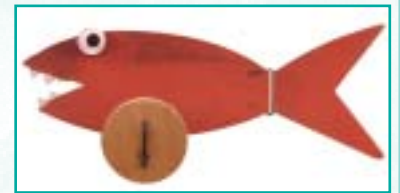

Spring Maintenance Tips



As the weather changes to Springtime conditions there are several things you can do to help maintain your home in top condition and save costly repairs later on. Most of these ideas are found in your New Home Reference Manual.

- Change your HVAC filters - The windy conditions we have had cause filters to clog with dust and therefore not allow your system to function properly.
- Have your HVAC system serviced by a licensed contractor - Regular service is needed to maintain your manufacturer's warranty terms. This servicing is not covered under your One-Year Limited Warranty from Siena.
- Window Weep Holes - simply vacuum these out to remove any buildup of bugs, dust or other debris. These are necessary for your home to exchange air regularly as you use appliances, exhaust fans and breathing.
- Check the caulking and grout in the bathrooms and kitchen areas these materials will expand and contract with the changes in temperature and humidity and may need to be filled in. This should be checked every month or two to ensure that no cracks are left open.
- If you have a fireplace, turn off the gas to conserve energy when not in use for a few months.
- Have your landscape maintenance person reset the timer clock for your irrigation system and check that all sprinklers and emitters are set properly and not over-spraying onto concrete or stucco areas.

Lastly, enjoy your home and this beautiful community. What a wonderful place to call home.

Fitness Center Rules

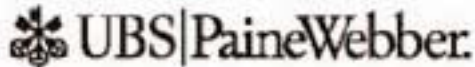
